EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This is a report for an application for the renewal of an off-licence for the premises situated at 491 Hillside Road, Dunedin, and known as "Bottle O". The criteria found at section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) apply to this application.
- The applicant does not seek any changes to the licence. The inspector considers that the sale and supply of alcohol under these conditions are consistent with the purpose of the Act and meets the criteria at section 131.
- Public notice of the application did not attract any opposition. Neither the Medical Officer of Health nor the Licensing Inspector oppose the grant of the renewal. However, the Police do oppose the renewal and are seeking the imposition of two conditions to the licence relating to the sale of single units and the external advertising and promotion of alcohol.

APPLICANT AND APPLICATION

The Applicant is a company with equal directors and shareholders, Michael Lee Sumner and Emma Kate Sumner. On 18 January 2022, Narinda Kumar Singla ceased being the sole director and he, along with Suman Lata, were removed as shareholders. Michael and Emma Sumner became the new shareholders and directors of the company. There is no record of the changes being notified to the Authority. However, the Inspector points out that the change is noted on



the renewal application so it may be possible previous Council staff were advised of the change but it was not recorded.

- The premises not only sells alcohol but also carries a wide range of general household grocery items for the nearby community.
- 6 This is the second renewal of the licence and no change to the conditions is sought.

PUBLIC NOTICE

- Public notice of the application did not attract any public objection and neither the Licensing Inspector nor Medical Officer of Health oppose the renewal.
- 8 However, the Police have opposed the licence renewal. Their grounds for opposition relate to sections 105(1)(a), (b), (h) and (i) of the Act. They believe the sale of single units of alcohol is not aligned with the object of the Act and raises doubts as to the suitability of the Applicant.
- The Police also state that the area within 800m radius of the premises is "one of the worst areas for calls for Police service in Dunedin City" and that the premises is "one of the main off-licence premises frequented by the surrounding vulnerable community."
- 10 The Police are seeking two additional conditions to the licence:
 - a) No single sales of beer, cider or RTDs priced at, or less than, \$6.00 per unit.
 - b) No alcohol advertising or promotion on the premises exterior.
- The Police state the Applicant is agreeable to the addition of the two conditions, but they have not received written confirmation.

CONCLUSION

- 12 This application has not attracted any objections nor opposition from the Medical Officer of Health nor Licensing Inspector.
- Similarly, the Police have not opposed the renewal per se, but they are seeking the imposition of two extra conditions to the licence.
- 14 This hearing will allow the parties to present their positions.







Bottle O Hillside Risk Mitigation Plan

As we are based in the middle of a residential area, we have an ongoing objective to minimise our impact on the community.

Currently we have the following processes or procedures in place to help with the objective.

- No deliveries accepted after 3pm minimises pedestrians visual contact with palletised deliveries.
- No Deliveries accepted after 3pm minimises the impact of trucks/vehicles using Helena St during the busiest time of the day.
- No external building product advertising. A discussion had with the Police last year regarding external poster usage – we were asked to not have them as they would have been visible to students walking by. We happily agreed and have NIL external poster advertisements.
- We do not open until 1000hrs Monday-Saturday (Licence is from 0900) to minimise the activity at the location during the morning travel times. Sunday opening time is 1100hrs.
- We have lots of off-street parking, this minimises the congestion at or around our busy roadways, especially during the peak traffic times.
- Last year (as the new owner) I removed 2 x 20' containers from the carpark
 which had been used as storage this opened up visibility between Hillside Rd
 & Helena St. Also, we have the trees trimmed regularly to ensure visibility is as
 clear as possible.

I am a firm believer in Continuous Improvement. In that regard, I am happy to engage anyone from the Community or Authorities that may have concerns or ideas to better our presence.

Host Responsibility Policy

Customer Statement: As good hosts, it is our expectation that you will enjoy your visit to our premises and we will make every effort to ensure your visit is pleasant and enjoyable. Our customers are expected to act in a responsible manner whilst on the premises and not disrupt or cause offence to other patrons or staff. Refusal of service should be viewed as an indication we are concerned for your welfare. Please note that staff must comply with their legal obligations under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (SSAA 2012).

Training: All staff are given a comprehensive induction on commencing employment and all staff have alcohol service responsibilities included as terms in their employment agreements. Ongoing training is given and it is management's policy to give our staff the skills and support they need to do their job responsibly. We employ experienced managers whose duty is to ensure that all staff know the responsibilities of alcohol service. Management reviews training needs and consults regularly and makes appropriate adjustments to ensure that training is current, relevant and appropriate.

Minors: Signage is displayed on the premises stating minors will not be served. As part of the training and induction programme staff are made aware that it is against the law to serve minors. The acceptable forms of ID to prove age are:

- NZ photo driver's license.
- The Kiwi Access 18+ card.
- A current passport.

Staff are also made aware of the requirements and consequences as set out in the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act (SSAA 2012) in respect to the sale or supply of alcohol to minors and the presence of minors on the premises. The Bottle-O has a "Sales To Groups" policy. All staff must follow this policy. If we are in any doubt as to a person's age, we will ask for identification. Any person considered to be 25 years old or younger will be required to produce identification. If a patron is not able to provide one of the **accepted** forms of identification that can be closely inspected for authenticity, the person is not served and asked to leave. This requirement is also included as an essential term of all employment agreements.

Intoxication: Signage is displayed on the premises stating intoxicated persons will not be served. Low and non-alcoholic beverages are available for sale. **It is an offence to serve anybody who is intoxicated.**

Staff have been trained to identify signs of, and assess intoxication through the Intoxication Assessment Tool. However, assessing intoxication can be difficult and because of this we regularly refresh staff regarding the signs to watch for, as well as the consequences of having an intoxicated person on premises. Staff are aware of the consequences in respect of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (SSAA 2012).

Assistance will be offered by the manager to anyone on the premises who is intoxicated. This may include access to safe transport, coffee, or other means to ensure their safety.

Promotions:

From time to time there may be promotions on the premises. Where promotions are offered, they should not encourage, or be likely to encourage the excessive consumption of alcohol. Water will be provided for all complimentary tastings.

At the same time, shareholders Suman Lata and Narinder Kumar Singh (previously 50 shares each) were both removed as shareholders, with Michael and Emma Sumner becoming the new equal shareholders of the company.

No (Council) records indicate the agencies or authority was notified of these changes under section 69 of the Act, however the applicant has noted this company structure change on their renewal application, and it is possible that previous Council staff were notified of this change (without documenting it).

Dear Sir/Madam

On 16/05/2023 Police received an application from Singla Group Limited for the renewal of the Off-Licence for the premises known as Bottle O.

This is an independently owned premises situated at 491 Hillside Road, Dunedin. The target market for this premises is the locality of South Dunedin in which it is situated. This is one of four Off-Licence premises within an 800m proximity. The others are:

- Caversham Liquor, South Road, Caversham
- Dunedin Malt House, Hillside Road, Dunedin
- Pak N Save, Hillside Road, Dunedin

Anecdotal and factual evidence regards this locality as a vulnerable community in regard to Alcohol Harm. 2018 New Zealand Census data indicates this area to have a deprivation score of 10. This is the highest score on the deprivation index and regarded as extreme.

As such Police oppose the renewal of this licence under Section 105:

- (a) Object of the Act
- (b) Suitability of the applicant
- (h) amenity and good order
- (i) amenity and good order already badly effected

It also falls short of section 106(iii), in regard to number of current premises of the same kind in the area.

Object of the Act

- (1) The object of this Act is that-
 - (a) The sale, supply and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly; and
 - (b) The harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimized.

- (2) for the purposes of subsection (1), the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol includes-
- (a) any crime, damage, death, disease, disorderly behavior, illness or injury, directly or indirectly caused or directly or indirectly contributed to, by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol; and
- (b) any harm to society generally or the community, directly or indirectly caused or directly or indirectly contributed to, by any crime, damage, death, disease, disorderly behavior, illness or injury of a kind described in paragraph (a)

The sale of single serve alcohol at a cheap price does not align with the object of the act in that the vulnerable community in which this premises is situated are exposed to higher levels of harm. Furthermore, the advertising of alcohol on the external surrounds of the premises is exposing an already vulnerable community to further harm.

Suitability of the Applicant

Single sales of alcohol at a cheap price adversely effects the suitability of the applicant. Alcohol advertising on the external premises causes harmful alcohol exposure to the surrounding community, particularly the sensitive locations:

- Bathgate Park Primary School (400 metres)
- St Bernadettes Primary School (550 metres)
- Carisbrook Primary School (600 metres)
- Helen Deem Kindergarten (900 metres)
- Kings and Queens High Schools (both approx. 1km)


Amenity and good order

Police records of alcohol related incidents in the area indicate that the 800m radius surrounding the premises is one of the worst areas for calls for Police service in Dunedin City. Frequent incidents of family harm and disorder are attended by Police within this area. Alcohol consumed at these incidents are all purchased at nearby off-licences, of which Bottle O is one of the main off licence premises commonly frequented by the surrounding vulnerable community.

Whilst Police have no statistics that directly correlate alcohol harm back to this premises, it is almost certain alcohol purchased at this premises results in nearby harm. The NZ Police Geospatial mapping application has provided the map below showing the location of the premises well within an area of the highest deprivation (red) and incidents where alcohol is a contributing factor.

Police have outlined above a number of sensitive locations within close proximity of this premises. Police opposition and recommendation goes to the Object of the Act to minimise the alcohol harm already experienced within this highly vulnerable community where exposure to alcohol is high.





Conditions Sought

To mitigate further risk, Police seek the following licence conditions:

- 1) No single sales of beer, cider, or RTDs priced at, or less than, \$6.00 per unit are to be sold.
- 2) No alcohol advertising or promotion on the external building premises

NOTE: Police have met with the applicant and advised of Police opposition. The applicant has indicated they may be amenable to these conditions; however, Police have received no correspondence confirming this.
